

New Students: Instructions and Frequently Asked Questions

How are financial aid awards determined at St. Stephen's?

St. Stephen's awards aid to families who show financial need, which is defined as the difference between the child's educational expenses and the family's financial resources. The school uses the methodology established by the School and Student Service for Financial Aid (SSS) in determining family financial resources.

SSS balances many factors in recommending awards, such as:

- Parents' and stepparents' assets
- Incomes and living costs
- Family size and the number of children matriculating in tuition-paying schools
- Income potential of a non-working spouse without young children
- Depreciation and most investment and business losses

After receiving the SSS award recommendation, St. Stephen's uses the information as a guide in determining each family's financial award package.

What kind of financial aid is available from St. Stephen's?

St. Stephen's seeks to achieve an economically diverse student body through need-based financial aid. In the 2010-2011 school year, 15 percent of the student body received a total of 1.9 million dollars in financial aid awards ranging from \$1,600 to \$37,500. These awards aided families with annual incomes ranging from below \$50,000 to over \$100,000.

St. Stephen's requires payment in full by July 1. We realize this is not always financially convenient. Therefore, families who complete the financial aid application are given the option of participating in a monthly payment plan. The payment plan allows families to spread out the cost of attendance over 10 monthly payments beginning in August and ending in May. Families who choose to participate in the payment plan will be required to enroll in Dewar's Tuition Refund Plan (www.tuitionrefundplan.com), which adds a cost of 2.7% on top of the balance owed after July 1, 2011. Families with a total balance less than \$5,000 by August 1, 2011, will not be required to enroll in Dewar's Tuition Refund Plan.

How do I apply for need-based financial aid?

To be considered for a financial aid award, families must:

1. Complete the online School and Student Service for Financial Aid Parents' Financial Statement (PFS) by **February 1, 2011**. To complete the PFS online and download the Business/Farm Statement please go to: www.sss.nais.org. Through this website you can submit the form online and download and print the PFS instructions in English or Spanish.

2. Submit 2010 W-2 forms and 2009 tax returns including all schedules and a Business/Farm Statement (if applicable) to School and Student Services (SSS) by February 1, 2011, per instructions on SSS website (www.sss.nais.org).

3. Submit 2010 tax returns including all schedules and a Business/Farm Statement (if applicable) to St. Stephen's Office of Admission before April 15, 2011, per instructions on SSS website (www.sss.nais.org).

What if I apply for admission after the February 1st priority deadline and I am also interested in applying for financial aid?

We encourage any student who applies to St. Stephen's after the February 1st priority deadline to complete the admission and financial aid applications as soon as possible. Admission decisions are then made on a space available basis and financial aid awards are made on a money available basis.

When will I be notified of an award decision if I submitted my financial aid materials by February 1, 2011? What if I submit my financial aid materials after February 1st?

Families who have a complete financial aid application on February 1, 2011, will receive a financial aid decision with their admission decision to be mailed on March 10, 2011.

For financial aid applications that are completed after the priority deadline of February 1, 2011, decisions will be made on a rolling basis.

Which St. Stephen's fees are considered when determining financial aid awards?

Tuition, facilities use fee, boarding supplement (if applicable), and special program fees (Soccer Academy, Tennis Academy or Theatre Focus programs, if applicable) will be considered in determining financial aid awards.

Fees that are not included in determining financial aid awards are: food service fee (required for all students), books, international student fee and English support classes (may be required depending on English language placement), health insurance (required for all students) and any private fine arts lessons.

Will applying for financial aid affect my child's chances for admission?

The Admission Committee initially reviews each admission application independent of the financial aid process. However, because St. Stephen's does not have an unlimited financial aid budget, the Committee may need to make difficult decisions about the number of financial aid applicants they can accept, within the limits of the budget. Occasionally, we will accept a student and place his or her name in our financial aid wait pool. If parents are able to find the necessary resources they may enroll their child. Also, if money later becomes available, the student may receive aid from St. Stephen's.

Can I meet with an Admission Director in regard to my financial aid application and/or award?

If you have any questions or concerns regarding the financial aid application process anyone in the Office of Admission (512-327-1213 ex. 210) will be able to address your questions. Also, the parent interview is a great opportunity for parents to ask questions regarding the financial aid process. We ask that appointments with Lawrence Sampleton, Director of Admission & Financial Aid, regarding financial aid not be scheduled until after you have received your financial aid decision letter.

Do I need to reapply for financial aid each year?

Yes. Since financial situations can change from year to year, families must complete an updated School and Student Service for Financial Aid Parents' Financial Statement (PFS) and submit their current tax returns and W-2 forms each year. Unless a major shift in finances occurs you can expect to receive a similar award each year (including adjustments for tuition increases).

HELPFUL TIPS

- Keep a complete set of copies of all forms submitted to School and Student Service for Financial Aid (SSS) and St. Stephen's Episcopal School.

DATES AND DEADLINES

FEBRUARY 1

Priority Deadline to complete the admission application process.
Priority Deadline to complete PFS, submit 2010 W-2 forms and all 2009 tax information
(W-2 forms, tax returns and Business/Farm statement, if applicable).

MARCH 10

Notification of 1st round admission and financial aid decisions for families who met the priority deadlines for Admission and Financial Aid.

APRIL 1

Enrollment contracts and deposits are due for students admitted during the first round decisions.

APRIL 15

Deadline to submit remaining 2010 tax information (tax returns and Business/Farm statement, if applicable).
